
**Fruits** Complete the crossword puzzle below



## <u>Across</u>

**3.** The elongated, edible fruit of these plants, having a thick yellowish to reddish skin and whitish, pulpy flesh.

**6.** The fruit of this plant, having a hard green rind and sweet watery pink or reddish flesh.

8. Any of various shrubby, usually prickly plants of the genus Rubus of the rose family that bear edible fruit,
11. A tropical American plant (Ananas comosus) having large swordlike leaves and a large, fleshy,

edible, multiple fruit with a terminal tuft of leaves. **13.** The fruit of any of these trees, having gritty, juicy

flesh and usually a shape that is spherical at the base and tapering toward the stalk.

**14.** The large, round fruit of this tree, having a yellow rind and juicy, somewhat acid pulp.

**15.** The yellow, red, or blackish fruit of any of these plants with a seed in the middle..

**1.** The fruit of any of these trees, having a sweetish, acidic juice.

**2.** The fruit of this tree, having an aromatic rind and juicy, acid pulp. Usually sour to taste.

**4.** A fragrant edible berry, of a delicious taste and commonly of a red color, the fruit of a plant of the genus Fragaria, of which there are many varieties. Also, the plant bearing the fruit. The common American strawberry is Fragaria virginiana; the European, F. vesca. There are also other less common species.

**5.** Any of various woody vines of the genus Vitis, bearing clusters of edible berries and widely cultivated in many species and varieties.

**7.** The firm, edible, usually rounded fruit of this tree. It keeps the doctor away.

**9.** The fuzzy brown fruit of this plant, containing sweet green pulp.

10. Blue, round fruit that has no seeds.

**12.** The pulpy fruit of Persea gratissima, a tree of tropical America. It is about the size and shape of a large pear; -- called also alligator pear, midshipman's butter.

13. Smooth-skinned, fleshy, edible fruit with a single stone.
